



Get Ahead of Cervical Cancer

Nearly 14,000 women will be diagnosed with cervical cancer in 2023, according to the American Cancer Society. Symptoms may not be obvious in the early stages.

THE GOOD NEWS: If detected early, cervical cancer is often curable. Getting screened regularly can dramatically reduce your risks.

THE GUIDELINES: For women aged 30-65, cervical cytology (Pap test) + HPV testing may be done every 5 years. Pap alone requires screening every 3 years. Women aged 21-29 must have Pap screenings every 3 years. With the Pap + HPV option, screening must still be performed every 3 years for this age group.
